

Barcelona 125th Anniversary Tournament - Wim van Noortwijk rememberance

The much anticipated Grand Masters tournament to celebrate the 125 years of Royal Club de Polo de Barcelona and also Wim van Noortwijk and his contribution to the growth of Grand Masters hockey internationally has come and gone (26 June – 3 July).

The joy and satisfaction of being together again was bursting forth from the faces of the participants, many of whom had not met since the European Nations Championship in 2019.

8 intense days of hockey and friendship with teams from Argentina and Australia as well as the European contingent.

For the curious, following are some interesting statistics from the tournament:

- 8 days on 3 pitches
- 42 teams (men 60+ 9 teams, men 65+ 13 teams, men 70+ 7 teams, men 75+ 5 teams and women 60+/65+/70+ 8 teams)
- 181 matches
- total number of goals scored 303 (excluding penalty stroke competitions), which is 1,67 goals per match
- highest scoring average with men 60+: 2,17goals per match
- lowest scoring average with women's section: 1,22 goals per match
- highest score in the tournament: men NHC 65+ vs Thistles 65+ 8-0

Italy M60 for the first time won the gold medal in a WGMA event.
